Chada Camp

Chada Camp is located in Katavi national park in western Tanzania.

Set up by safari legend Roland Purcell back in 1996, Chada quickly established a reputation as a really wild and whacky camp, where safari was often excitingly unpredictable. These days Roland is rarely in camp himself and the place has calmed down a little, but this remains a spirited and uplifting location.

The camps itself is a classic high specification tented affair, set under lead wood trees on the fringes of open grasslands. Activities are centered on vehicle and walking safari.

Chada Camp is quite simply one of the best safari locations in Africa, somewhere that we absolutely adore and which attracts consistently fabulous feedback from guests.

A twice weekly shared charter flight connects Chada Camp with the fabulous Zoe's Camp in Mahale Mountains, to make an awesome but pricey seven night combination.
